Grace at the Edges

Numbers chapters 13 and 14 are two of the most tragic chapters in Scripture. In chapter 13-14:39 we note that the people of Israel have been brought through the desert and are at the banks of the Jordan. God is about to lead them out of the barrenness of the desert into the fruitfulness of the land of promise. They are on the doorstep of entering into all that they looked for and longed for since their deliverance from Egypt. They are on the doorstep of entering into their place of calling and destiny. Yet they do not enter. They have been brought to the edge of the Jordan and the spies report on all that they have found in the land of promise. They conclude that it is too beyond their capacity and refuse to go up in the grace that would be provided to them. They will return to the barrenness of the desert and live out their days there.

Conversely, in chapter 14:40-45 they decided to move out on their own into the land that God had promised and fail miserably. They have concluded the risks facing them in the challenges of the promised land

- ³ are preferable to a life lived out in the wilderness. They attempt what
- 4 God wanted for them in his power in their own power. They move out apart from grace in their own capacity and fail.
- We know their story well. Too many have been touched by the love and grace of God and hunger to live into the missional call, only to feel as if it is always just beyond their reach. We stand at the edge of a chasm and see the land we live for and long for and wonder is there any way to build a bridge that would take us to the land of fruitfulness and mission. That bridge is the bridge of GRACE.

In the same way we come into the life of Jesus by grace we must live the missional life by grace.

Over the last few months I have been sensing God moving me into a season of empowering persons to live into their missional call by unlocking GATES (**G**race **A**t **T**he **E**dge**S**). I believe this upcoming season will be a pivotal season in our capacity to live into the mission God has for us as his people in Floyd. My hope is that every facet of our church will be impacted in this season.

Charitable Assumption: In the Anglican Church they practice what is know as "Charitable Assumption". They will assume the best of people. I believe that the leaders and participants in our Sunday School Classes and Ministries know Jesus, want to grow as his disciples, and want to be a part of bringing others into the life he has given them.
