

The INFORMER FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Grace at the Edge: God's grace (gifts) take us beyond our capabilities into our dreams.

This has been the good news or "Gospel" for me in all of life. This morning as I write this; I had been bombarded with a multitude of bad news from what seems all directions. The least of which; was a fall in the bathroom this morning that seems to have hurt the very knee that has been operated on multiple times. As I arrived at church this morning, I simply shared a little of what I had been facing the last couple of days with Deanna and Patsy Harris. God gave me a wonderful gift through Patsy; she gathered Deanna and I in a circle around her and prayed for me. What a wonderful gift to have these two lifting me up in prayer. I began to sense new strength, hope, and peace welling up in my spirit. God's grace (gifts) always take us beyond our capabilities into our dreams.

Throughout my days I have found that my dreams that are grounded in God's dreams are always beyond me. Whether it is the dreams I have for my marriage, my kids, the church, my friends.....and the list could go on; the living into the dream is always beyond my capacity. Often, I will offer all of myself completely to the fulfillment of his calling or dream, and yet find I am woefully short. I have to be reminded once again that it is God's Grace; not my capacity, that moves me into the dreams he has for me. As I remember this there are two questions, I engage with that really help me to begin to live by grace and move into what he has for me.

First, I ask, "what are the gifts God is offering to me that I have been unwilling to receive?" This may be a relationship he wants me to initiate. This may be an offer or blessing from someone that I have been pridefully unwilling to accept. This may be an opportunity for training and mentoring available that I have been unwilling to accept. It may be as simple as accepting an offer from someone to pray for me in specific things. Where is it that God is providing yet I am unwilling to receive? This is a huge question to wrestle with, as you move from striving in your power and living by grace in his. This is all about being good stewards of the grace already offered. Quite frankly, I have often found that it is best not to into enter into the next step until I get this one right.

Secondly, "what are the gifts from God that need to come to bear that are not being offered in this moment?" This is all about, "what do I need to ask for". God wants us to ask for things, as any good father would. I am always glad to know that we trust his love for us, and his ability enough to ask for what we sense we need. Again, let me remind you, to take care of first things first. Live in the grace that is already being provided, and you will be amazed at the faith that will well up in your heart and give you the confidence to ask for greater things.

My prayer is that in the days ahead, you will know the joy and power of living in "Grace at the Edge".

September 29: Family Sunday—This Family Sunday will feature a Creative Worship Service, designed for Children of all ages.




