Fruits of the Incarnation; God with Us

It is considered one of the top NBA Finals Moments ever. Willis Reed the leader of the New York Knicks had been injured in Game 5 of the NBA Championship, and had sat out Game 6. In his absence the Lakers had crushed the Knicks. No one expected him to make a return for Game 7.

Steve Aschburner in an article on this Game captures the significance of Reed's return, "he received painkiller injections in his thigh and limped onto the court during warmups. The crowd already at Madison Square Garden erupted as the Lakers stopped warming up to stare at Reed. 'When I saw that,' Knicks guard Walt Frazier said, 'something told me we might have these guys.'" Reed only played sparingly, and finished only with four points and three rebounds. His team mates account their remarkable victory toward simply his presence; it brought them hope and inspiration.

One of my favorite titles for Jesus is, Immanuel, which means God with Us. As we peruse the Gospels, we notice that Jesus embodies and released the presence of God through the indwelling and outpouring of the Spirit. Jesus was Spirit who became born of flesh, so that we who are born of the Flesh can be born of the Spirit. This is what the incarnation is all about, resulting in our capacity to live in the realty of God with Us.

As we consider this reality coming to fruition in the Christmas narrative, I want us to contemplate what the fruits of the incarnation are as we celebrate them through the Advent Wreath. Beginning with December 1st we begin a journey of celebrating God with Us and how that brings Hope, Peace, Joy and Love.

My prayer for your family and mine is that these four fruits of the incarnation will be released into our hearts, into our families, our church and out to the community. What would your Christmas celebration be like this year if it simply was an expression of these four fruits, all of which are fruits of the Spirit. So may God's Hope, God's Peace, God's Joy, and God's Love be yours through the presence of the Spirit this Christmas Season and throughout the New Year!
