The INFORMER FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Rejoice In The Lord Always

I recently heard a survey quoted that stated since the onset of the Covid-19 Pandemic 40% of Americans have dealt with significant episodes of depression, and many of those have contemplated suicide. My heart is grieved for many who have found themselves and their lives now defined by such a sense of loss that has birthed within them great fear and anxiety. Most of us have gone through a season of grief in one way or another in this season. Some have had loss compounded upon loss and the weight is unbearable.

Paul writes the letter to Philippi from a jail cell and life is very grim. He has experienced loss upon loss, and yet the Lord has strengthened his heart and he is able to write to these people that he loves dearly and longs to see this glorious letter. In Philippians 4:4-7 we read, "A Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice! Let your gentleness be evident to all. The Lord is near. Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus." The last words of instruction we expect to hear from one languishing in prison are "Rejoice in the Lord always." Yet they are the words he offers. He offers them for their time of difficulty, they are the words that must have captured the hearts of the Pilgrims as they prepared for the first Thanksgiving, having journeyed through such a season of difficulty and loss, and they are the words that will bring solace to wounded hearts in this difficult season we now face.

Rejoice in the Lord, not <u>for</u> all things but <u>in</u> all things. We offer to him the petitions of our hearts because we know that he loves us, is for us, and is able to do all things. We are able to find thanksgiving, and divine peace tending to our hearts and expressed in our Spirit because our hope is not in the circumstances of life but in the one who is the author and sustainer of life.

My encouragement to all of us as we enter into this season of Thanksgiving is to allow the passion, presence, and power of God to protect your hearts, and change your perspective. When we embrace these days from the perspective and hope that is birthed by a deep faith in the faithful one, Our Father in Heaven, then we do not have to be instructed to rejoice in the Lord always; we just do.

Praying that the amazing, powerful, and permanent grace of Jesus our Lord will overwhelm your heart and mind, and give birth to a season of thanksgiving that comes from a heart that is resting in the peace that is ours in Christ.

Beyond Capacity: A Movement of Grace

Maybe like me, you have found yourself once again coming to the place of understanding that being the person, parent, friend, citizen, or follower of Jesus that you are called to be is so far, "Beyond Your Capacity." Even in the best of times, living into these callings require more than we have to offer. However, this extended season of difficulty and loss has intensified our sense of need. We all know what it is like to stand with Indiana Jones at the edge of the cliff in the iconic scene from "Indiana Jones and the Last Crusade". Jones stands at the edge of a chasm, staring desperately out toward the other side. We see a look of exhaustion and desperation mingled upon his face. Somehow, he must cross the chasm and reach an outcrop on the other side in order to continue the mission of recovering the Holy Grail. This mission that has gained heightened importance for his father's life now hangs in the balance. Indiana must find the grail and use water poured out from the "holy chalice" to bring healing to his father, who lies dying from a bullet wound. He has reached the end of himself. He knows that there is no way that he has the capacity to reach the other side.

Maybe you feel like you are standing on the edge of the cliff with Indiana right now, as one who simply wants to follow Jesus as a faithful parent, friend, student, employer, employee, citizen, church leader, or volunteer. I have always found that it is the grace and goodness of God that gives us the capacity to move beyond ourselves into the fulfillment of the callings that are ours in Christ.

Journey back with me to join Indiana Jones in his time of desperation, exhaustion, and sense of futility. We know that he is able to complete this heroic quest. But how? In this moment of desperation, he decides to look at the ancient book once again to see if there is a clue that would guide him. He notices something new and realizes as he whispers to himself that it is a leap of faith. Too make it to the other side he must trust the clue that has been offered to him. He steps out in faith onto what looks to be nothing but air. As he does so, his feet finds purchase upon another marvelous gift; a bridge that is unseen until one steps upon it in faith. Indy is living once again in the reality that every hero discovers; "It is gifts that take us beyond our capacities into the callings of our lives"!

I believe with all my heart that God is using this season to prune and prepare a people for a great Movement of Grace that will unleash his transforming power to the world. Over the last couple of years, the Lord has been steadily leading, and prodding me to partner with others in following him in a journey of launching, "Beyond Capacity: A Movement of Grace." The people of this movement will love, serve, and empower others for they depend upon the love, service, and empowerment of God.

What would it look like for Floyd Baptist Church to live beyond our capacity and be a part of this movement of grace? I am inviting our Sunday School Classes, Deacons, Ministry Leaders, Volunteers, Parents, Anyone and Everyone who is a part of Floyd Baptist Church to explore this with me!

You will be hearing more about how you can be a part of this movement in the days ahead. Right now, be praying for me as I lead the Beyond Capacity Team. Be listening to God's invitation to join the movement. It is God's Grace that will be the difference in these days.


