Dear Church Family,

Focusing

Howbeit when he, the Spirit of truth, is come, he will guide you into all truth: for he shall not speak of himself; but whatsoever he shall hear, that shall he speak, and he will show you things to come. Volunteer signup sheets are located on the bulletin board next to the choir room.




