FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Thanksgiving

"This poor man cried, and the LORD heard him, and saved him out of all his troubles. The angel of the LORD encampeth round about them that fear him, and delivereth them. O taste and see that the LORD is good: blessed is the man that trusteth in him. O fear the LORD, ye his saints: for there is no want to them that fear him." Psalm 34:6–9

We often think of the first Thanksgiving as the feast the Pilgrims held in 1621 to celebrate the good harvest that would see them through the coming winter. But in reality, from their first day in the New World, they were continually giving thanks to God. William Bradford, for many years governor of the Plymouth colony, wrote of their arrival: "Being thus arrived in a good harbor and brought safe to land, they fell upon their knees & blessed ye God of heaven, who had brought them over ye vast & furious ocean, and delivered them from all ye periles & miseries therof, againe to set their feet on ye firme and stable earth. Every day we receive blessings from God which we do not deserve. Every day—in ways we do not even see or recognize—He protects us and provides for us. Thus every day should be a day of Thanksgiving. The ungrateful heart that takes blessings for granted and believes that they are deserved is a blight on any believer. Let us be a people of praise, fulfilling God's command to give Him glory.



OCC FOCUS FOR NOVEMBER It's All About Jesus

November is here! Time for Shoebox Collection Week November 17-24. There is a sign-up sheet for working during that week on the bulletin board beside the Pastor's office. Please consider helping us for a couple hours during that week. Thanks in advance.

Our focus for the next three weeks will be collecting money for the shipping and discipleship literature that goes in each box. The \$10 fee that is collected for each box is used for shipping, training of workers in the area, and teaching the Greatest Journey lessons to the children and family members following the delivery of the boxes. We are told that one out of every four boxes result in at least one or more persons coming to Christ.

The Goal Page for Floyd Baptist has been set up. Just log on to <u>Samaritans Purse.org/goal/search</u> to build your box. You can do it or let them do it for a cost of \$30. Most of these boxes go to hard-to-reach areas that Samaritan's Purse is very limited in what they can bring in.

We wanted to give you a plan for our own packing of boxes. It will start on **November 9** in the afternoon folding together the boxes to ready them for filling. On Wednesday, **November 12**, from 4–5 p.m., our **children ages 3–10 are invited to come with a parent** to pack boxes. **The Youth** will pack during their meeting time that night. There will be a Business meeting that night in the Sanctuary, but anyone wishing to stay a while can help pack some boxes. On Thursday, **November 13** the WARM group, **and anyone else who can help,** will be packing boxes from 9:00 a.m. until.... Please consider coming to help pack a box. It is quite a blessing!

We thank God for allowing us to spread the Light Of Jesus across the world. Thank **you** for being a part of this ministry as we come to the best part – packing the boxes to be sent around the world.
